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
IMPACTING PROGRAM QUALITY AND FIELD IMPROVEMENT

We are always looking for spaces to host our leader roundtables. They allow for connections amongst those working in the out-of-school time field that are often isolated in a program or at a site.

Sharing best practice and having a learning community of support can reduce staff turnover and increase program outcomes

It could be supporting a program series for staff development such as “Coaching and Learning for After School Professionals (CLASP), or contributing to events such as our annual Lights on Afterschool Celebration or Afterschool Conference. These would include prominent logo placement, a word from the podium at the start of events, or a slide in the beginning of a training module.

We can customize sponsorships that can span across events and our initiatives. We are eager to find like-minded individuals, companies, or philanthropic partners to build new relationships to provide support for those who support children and families in afterschool programs across Connecticut daily.

The investment into our professional development opportunities nets dividends to the field we serve. Typically 1 staff person works with 10 to 15 children who are impacted by this person’s skills and competencies in programming and activities. Sponsoring professional development experiences allows the Network to develop and re-use content, including sponsorship recognition beyond the initial investment.

2025 OVERVIEW

In 2025 after school professionals took part in a day of recharging and celebrating each other. We honored individuals during our annual recognition awards ceremony and hosted educator, activist, and community leader Latoya Fernandez as our keynote speaker. The day included Relaxation Stations (Yard Games, Chair Massages, Henna, science activities and more), facilitated by the Network staff, CT Science Center and New Britain ROOTS. We had over 125 participants.
